Admissions Requirements

Applicants must hold a Secondary School Diploma (SSD), a Diploma of Vocational Studies (DVS) or have studies deemed sufficient by the College. (Special requirements apply, visit website for more details.)

Equivalence Credits

Our DCS graduates in Paralegal Technology who wish to continue their studies in law will receive the following equivalence credits (in accordance with admission requirements):

- Université Laval : 12 applicable credits
- Université de Sherbrooke: 6 applicable credits
- Université d’Ottawa: 9 applicable credits
- Université de Montréal: 7 applicable credits

Where Does it Lead?

Graduates of the Paralegal Technology program can directly enter the job market in various roles such as paralegals, clerks, and compensation agents, etc., working for several firms or companies. Additionally, they have the option to pursue specialized training to become bailiffs.

In addition, graduates with a DCS can also continue their university studies in law or other programs.

Advantages of the Program

Why choose this program?

- The program includes an **internship** during the last semester, allowing you to apply your learning in a real-world setting and gain practical experience in the field. (**Internships last 15- weeks for the DCS programs and 6 weeks for the ACS programs.**)
- On average, **96% of students are hired** after completing their educational training, with many finding positions in organizations where they completed their internships.
- To enhance students’ public speaking skills, we offer a **Debate Club**. It allows students to develop their speaking abilities while exploring important issues that shape our world, culminating in a final debate competition.
- The faculty of teachers consists of **professionals in the field**, including experienced lawyers, notaries and bailiffs, who are passionate and dedicated to conveying their knowledge and expertise.
- The program is enriched with **numerous hours of training in the computer laboratory**, combining theoretical knowledge with practical applications of legal software.
- Additionally, students participate in **trial simulations**, that provide practical experience and a concrete opportunity to develop their skills effectively.
- Students also have several **networking opportunities** and activities, such as conferences with judges and industry professionals, courthouse visits, reunion events and more.
