

# Excellence Scholarships

Collège O'Sullivan de Montréal inc., offers **academic scholarships of \$500** each to students who are completing their last year of secondary high school studies and are admitted for the first time to a full-time Diploma of Collegial Studies (DCS) program.

The scholarships are awarded based on high school academic achievement. There are no forms to be filled out; students who submit a request for admission to a full-time DCS program before March 1st are automatically eligible\*.

A scholarship is offered by **Fairfax Financial** Holdings to a high school graduate who is admitted for the first time to a full-time Diploma of Collegial Studies program.

The scholarship is awarded based on high school academic record and financial need of the student. The selected student is eligible for this scholarship for the duration of his studies at the College if all requirements are met.

These scholarships are given in two instalments: the first half in the Fall semester and the second half in the Winter semester, if all requirements are met. These scholarships are applied towards tuition fees.

\* Certain conditions must be respected.

In addition, we are awarding **ten (10) \$1000 scholarships** to candidates who submit their admissions application to one of our DCS programs. These scholarships are applied towards the tuition fees for the same academic semester. Applications must be submitted by March 1st of this year\*.

**Colonel J.R. Rousseau Scholarships (President of O'Sullivan 1940-1960)**

**Five (5) \$300 scholarships** are awarded annually. Candidates must submit an essay describing their reasons for seeking a business career and their long-term goals. These scholarships are applied towards the tuition fees for the following academic semester. Applications must be submitted by May 1st of each year\*.

This award is granted to a student who has successfully completed the four literature courses with the highest average. This student must have excelled in oral and written English.

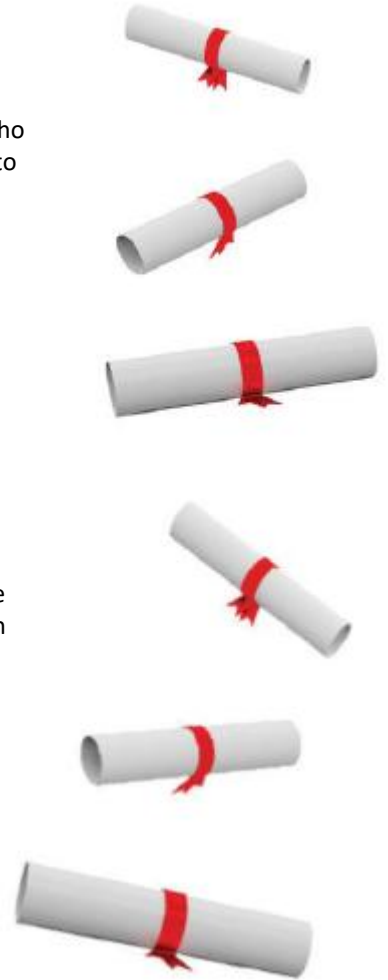
